Commencement Date - School for students commences on Wednesday 1 February 2023 at 8.20am. A full school assembly will commence at 8.20am in the Goldfields Arts Centre.

Our office will be open from 25 January 2023. All teaching staff will be involved in professional learning on Monday and Tuesday 30 & 31 January.

Structure of the week - Classes are normally scheduled on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. However, as **we commence school on a Wednesday this year**, we start with a whole school assembly at Goldfields Arts Centre followed by a modified Monday timetable on this day. Classes commence at 8.20am and finish at 3.15pm each day. Our day starts early and students should be in class ready for their first lesson at 8.20 am, so it is very important that they arrive on time to do this. Arriving late disrupts their learning and interrupts that of other students as the teacher must stop to explain to the late arrival what the class is doing.

Parents - please note that the College needs your support to ensure students do not view Wednesdays as a 'day off'. Students may be required to attend workshops, seminars and academic programs on this day. These sessions are designed to assist them in achieving their personal and academic goals.
