FROM THE PRINCIPAL Dan McCormack


Now that the academic year is up and running, it appears that the majority of our students are thriving in the young adult ethos of our college. A high number of students have very definite goals and have started their studies with solid working patterns, which is very pleasing.

Please take care when dropping off and picking up at the start and end of each day. The corner in front of the HUB building is quite congested with cars, buses and students at these times. So too is the corner of Wilson and Macdonald Streets. It may be wise to arrange drop offs and pickups in other spots around the campus depending on where your son/daughter starts and finishes. Please also follow the 'No Parking' areas in bus bays so that we continue to have a smooth traffic run. Likewise, students need to take care at all times while crossing Cassidy Street and using the pedestrian crossing at Wilson Street.

DRIVING TO SCHOOL - All students who want to drive or ride a moped to school are reminded they need to ensure they have completed the 'Application for Student Motor Vehicle Form' and return it to the HUB with a copy of their valid driver's licence. Students are also reminded that they are not permitted to drive/ride up and down the campus during the school day.

ONLINE LITERACY & NUMERACY ASSESSMENT - All Year 11 and 12 students are required to meet a minimum standard for literacy and numeracy to achieve their WACE. Students who have demonstrated Band 8 or higher in NAPLAN tests in Year 9 or achieved 3s via the Online Literacy & Numeracy Assessment (OLNA) in Year 10 will not be required to sit that component again. The first round of OLNA testing will take place from 27 February to 10 March. Staff will identify and advise students who are required to attempt OLNA testing.

INFORMATION FOR ATAR STUDENTS

Special examination arrangements are provisions made by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority that will assist students who have a permanent or temporary disability that could disadvantage them in demonstrating their knowledge, understanding and skills in the ATAR course examinations. Special arrangements are available for practical or written examinations. The types of disabilities considered are physical disability; illness eg diabetes; chronic fatigue; vision impairment; hearing impairment; fine motor disability; specific learning disability; psychological/neurological disability; ADD/ADHD. Types of arrangements that can be considered are extra working time; extra reading time; rest time; use of scribe/computer etc.

Candidates with a known injury or illness which will exist at the start of Term 3 need to apply for special arrangements to be examined in an alternative format, if their injury or illness will affect their participation in the standard practical examination of any course. This is particularly relevant to those lining up for surgery before that time. Applications are due by Thursday, 30 March for written examinations and Wednesday, 26 July for practical examinations. If a student is diagnosed with a new disability or is injured after 30 March, a late application can be submitted.

The granting of special examination arrangements is not automatic, but depends on the provision of medical and/or psychological evidence to justify the decision. Any ATAR students wanting to apply for Special Examination Arrangements need to arrange a meeting with Ms Baxter or Mrs Dowling as soon as possible to discuss their eligibility and commence the application process. WACE EXAMINATIONS – YEAR 12

The School Curriculum and Standards Authority has advised that the 2023 WACE written examinations will run from Monday 30 October to Friday 17 November. The timetable will be published in June.

Physical Education Studies Practical examinations take place between - Saturday, 23 September to Sunday, 1 October (Saturday, Sunday and the public holiday included).

Students will be provided with individual examination timetables closer to the examination period. Please be mindful of the above dates when booking holidays as failure to attend WACE examinations will impact on Year 12 Graduation.

Please also be aware that our Year 12 Semester 2 exams commence on Thursday, 5 October – which is at the end of the October school holidays.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

We encourage students to bring their own device.

What mobile device can I purchase?

- Any mobile device of your choice: e.g. tablet, laptop, netbook, 2 in 1 laptop (tablet and laptop combo).
- Running any platform you desire, e.g. Android, MacOS, Windows, etc.
- Mobile phone screens are too small and hence are not considered useful in a classroom setting. Screen size must be a minimum of 8-10".

Software required

- Platform / Operating System = any. E.g. Android, MacOS, Windows, etc.
- MS Office available free to all EGC students.
- The Adobe suite available free to eligible students.
- Antivirus / Anti-malware we suggest you download the Microsoft Defender Antivirus https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Microsoft Defender Antivirus
- Adobe Acrobat Reader this is available free from https://get.adobe.com/reader/

Technical Assistance offered at EGC

- Student workshops for:
 - Connecting their own device to our wireless network
 - Access the EGC printers
 - How to install software required (listed above)
 - Accessing student email and Connect
 - o Basic technology literacy. For example; saving work, submitting work.

Security and Use

- All devices and equipment brought to school are AT YOUR OWN RISK. If lost or stolen, you will need to ensure it is covered under your own insurance. Some contents insurance policies cater for this.
- Students are not permitted to unplug EGC equipment to charge their BYOD.
- Charging at power points across the school is AT YOUR OWN RISK.
- Students should endeavour to come to school with their device already fully charged.
- All students and parents must sign the Acceptable Computer User Agreement before being granted Department Online Services access.
- It is a privilege not a right to use devices in class. Students must follow teacher's instructions regarding BYO Device use. If a device is being used inappropriately or against teacher instructions, you will be asked to put it into your bag.
- Storage and safety of your device is AT YOUR OWN RISK this includes:
 - Physical storage and carrying of device
 - Anti-virus software
 - Access to your device, e.g. Username and password
