
Accompanying the report will be a copy of their 'Student Course Mark Analysis Graph'. This graph is like the NAPLAN results you may have seen in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 and compares your son's/daughter's marks in each of their courses to all other students studying the same course at EGC. The black dot on this graph represents their mark.

After reading the report, look at this graph to see where they stand compared to other students doing the same course. It is an ideal time for students to reflect on their progress and goals. We have included a Goal Setting Questionnaire for them to set some goals for next semester and reflect on how they can improve their results.

There are some students who haven't yet grasped the concept that they need to work in their courses in order to achieve passing grades. On the downside for those who want to leave school, they are not showing themselves in a particularly good light to employers with these results. I'm sure that you would all agree that we don't want to get to a stage of having to repeat a year of schooling, so the time for change is now.

Congratulations to all Year 12 students who achieved pleasing results in their Semester 1 reports and are on track for WACE achievement. It is important that Year 12 students realise that the majority of all assessments need to be completed by the end of Term 3. The message is work hard and do your very best as the end of your schooling is coming quickly.

PREMIER'S ANZAC TOUR 2023

Zoe Stockdale – Year 11 – took part in this year's Premier's ANZAC Tour. Here are some of her highlights.

From 16 to 26 April, I departed on the 2023 Premier's ANZAC Student Tour to Sydney and Auckland, New Zealand, with 9 other students and 3 teachers to commemorate the 78th anniversary of the end of the Second World War. To be selected for this amazing opportunity I had to write an essay in response to the question "In what way might efforts on the home front be seen as important as battles fought overseas?" and complete an interview in Perth. Some of the places we visited in Sydney included the ANZAC Memorial in Hyde Park, Sydney Jewish Museum, Middle Head, North Fort, Cockatoo Island and Hyde Park Barracks. In Auckland, we visited the Torpedo Bay Naval Museum, Auckland War Memorial Museum, Te Hana Ao Marama Marae and Māori Cultural Centre, Stony Batter on Waiheke Island and of course attended the dawn service on ANZAC day.

The dawn service in Auckland was held at the Auckland War Memorial Museum and was a truly humbling experience, especially when the veterans marched out as it made us reflect on the experiences endured by those who served and encouraged us to show gratitude towards the sacrifices they made. Fortunately, I was chosen to carry the wreath and represented the people of Australia alongside Consul General for Australia, Mr Brad Williams. Prior to the service I was able to talk with many important individuals - Deputy Prime Minister Hon Carmel Sepuloni, Mayor of Auckland His Worship Wayne Brown, Rear Admiral Jim Gilmour representing the New Zealand Defence Force and many others.

The tour gave us a deeper connection and understanding of the ANZAC legacy, reinforcing the fact that this legacy should be passed through generations no matter how far we get from the First and Second World Wars and the Vietnam War. Being able to see important places relating back to the ANZACs and hearing real stories from people provides an important aspect of which a history textbook could not, a personal and emotional connection to the ANZAC legacy.
