Uniforms: Safety, Connection and Pride at EGC

At Eastern Goldfields College, our uniform is about more than appearance—it helps keep our community safe, connected and proud.

As an open campus integrated within the Kalgoorlie-Boulder community, students and staff move between learning spaces and community facilities throughout the day. Wearing identifiable EGC uniform makes it easy to recognise who belongs to our college community, supporting both safety and wellbeing.

Clear identification allows staff to quickly recognise students in their care and helps students and community members know who to approach for support or assistance. A consistent uniform creates a safer environment and strengthens our shared sense of belonging.

Our uniform also reflects pride in being part of EGC. It represents a community built on respect, connection and opportunity.

With cooler weather continuing, all students and staff are expected to ensure their upper body clothing is clearly identifiable as EGC uniform. This includes wearing an EGC polo and either an EGC jacket or an EGC jacket layered over a hoodie. The visible outer layer should always be EGC uniform so that everyone remains warm, comfortable and easily identifiable.

Safety also includes appropriate footwear. Students are expected to wear enclosed, secure shoes, with athletic footwear preferred for everyday wear. Suitable footwear helps reduce the risk of injury and supports participation in the wide range of learning opportunities available at EGC.

We thank families for their ongoing support. By wearing the correct uniform and appropriate footwear each day, students help create a safer, more connected and inclusive college community.

Have these ready before you claim:

- ✓ **ServiceWA app**
Download or update the app.
- ✓ **Digital ID (myID)**
Log in through the ServiceWA app.
- ✓ **WA student number (WASN)**
Needed for each eligible child.
- ✓ **Student details**
Name at enrolment, date of birth, school name and year level.
- ✓ **Bank account details**
For the payment to be deposited.

Who can claim?
Parents and carers of WA students from Kindergarten to Year 12 with a valid WA student number.

How to claim
The fastest way is through the ServiceWA app. Alternative claim options will be available via the Department of Education website when needed.
